

President, Ray Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:32 PM and opened the meeting with 13 seated members and 2 guests (Jo Sarti, Allison Paker and Ron Ishizaki). The meeting was held at Lori's Diner.

Recording Secretary, Fred Davis read the minutes of the Apr 12 General meeting. Minutes were approved as read. Treasurer, Larry Benson submitted his report. Corresponding Secretary, Gary Acquistapace reported nothing of interest in the mail. Curator, Ken Barr reported no new acquisitions. Historian, Sally Johnson reported that she had received

NEW BUSINESS:

(Medals are normally \$15 until the show at which time they increase to \$18 - the initial cost might change in the future due to the increasing cost of silver). He also proposed to increase the cost of the ANA medals to spot +2 (rounded to the nearest dollar) when silver is over \$13. Motion passed. Keith Scott suggested creating a list of members with their collecting interests. The Board recommended that the member inquiring about a particular interest bring it up during Show and Tell.
