At the October 23rd Board Meeting

The October, 2006 SJCC Board Meeting was called to order by **Vice President, Trisha Russ** at 7:30 PM. **Trish** welcomed ten seated members and two guests, **Fred Davis** and **Ron Ishizaki**. Minutes from the October 12, 2006 General Meeting were read and approved. **Treasurer, Larry Benson** gave his financial report. We've received \$5500 in the latest bourse receipts and \$1500 in medal sales. **Curator, Ken Barr** has purchased some amusement tokens and medals to add to the club collection. **Program Chair, Patricia Russ** reports **Larry Benson** will be the speaker for November 2007. **Youth Chair, Sally Johnson** says stockings have been purchased for December's meeting. **Chuck Call** has donated items for stocking stuffing. **Ken Barr** is in the process of purchasing Christmas prizes. The newsletter will have a reminder about November's All Gold Raffle. **President, Ray Johnson** will mention several times at the meeting to buy tickets. Please only buy before meeting and at break. **Medals Chair Gary Acquistapace** reports medals and raffle tickets are here and ready

for distribution. The lost medals have not been replaced yet.

OLD BUSINESS **Larry Benson** reports that Capital Plastics was purchased by Jaco Products Inc. When the holders were bought a few years ago they were only \$13.25. **Larry** was quoted \$61.50 but he negotiated the price down to \$16.50, plus shipping. A suggestion was made to try to get Capital Plastics to use a less expensive shipping method to save even more. **Larry** made a motion (which was seconded) to purchase 140 printed Presidential Award holders and 15 blank holders. After some discussion, the motion was voted on & passed. Another thank you was made to **Sally** for the lasagna. **Sally** says it was only \$82, making the cost the same as for hot dogs.

NEW BUSINESS There was a discussion on what to write on the cakes for the Christmas party. The cakes will say "Seasons' Greetings" and "Happy Holidays".

SHOW BUSINESS 72 dealers have signed up for the 2007 show. 2 more are interested in advertising. 2/3 of the tables are filled. Another complaint was received saying the Crowne Plaza is again not allowing king-size beds at the discounted rate. **Patricia** will look into it. No complaints have been received about our higher bourse fee. Lots of volunteers have been found after the request at the September Board Meeting for people to help get the supplies and equipment from the locker to the show and then back after the show. The storage locker is open from 6 am to 8 pm including Martin Luther King Day so it will not be a problem getting in and out. A back-up electrician is available if necessary. Two dealers, whose wives have passed, will be sent sympathy cards on behalf of the club. A full-scale floor plan with row numbers was given to **Ray** from **Larry**. The Fire Marshall will also need a floor plan. Police officers are needed for security. **Alan Douglass** will meet with **Lee Wilson** on that subject. **Larry** brought an idea from the Central States Numismatic Society about limiting bourse passes.
