Ron also recommended a dinner for the clean-up crew. The meeting was adjourned at 9:17.

HOW DID YOU LIKE THE SHOW?

We're anxious to know how our club members liked the show this year.

Every year is a new adventure and this year was no different. We encountered new problems with our new location. The Fairgrounds was, pretty much, the only place we had to go after Parkside Hall was taken over by the Tech Museum. So, we decided to make the Fairgrounds work. The hall was about the right size, it was all one, big room, we were told that the lighting would be upgraded (it wasn't) and the Fairgrounds location is in San Jose and easy to find. There were a lot of things that we just couldn't change, but we did get some concessions. We were able to get on site, next to the hall, parking passes for the dealers and show volunteers and the tables and chairs were a little cheaper. The Fairgrounds crew set up our tables and chairs, so there was a savings there. The Fairgrounds people were very cooperative; they kept the place clean and emptied the trash every night. The room, upstairs, that we thought was going to be our meeting room, wasn't in a condition that we could use, so we set up a pipe-and-drape room at the far end of the hall. We thought that by letting people in free we would eliminate the complaints about the parking costs. People still complained that it was too much. We also got complaints about the distance from the parking lot to the hall. We weren't expecting this since it isn't any further than some of the lots from Parkside Hall and, for that matter, the distance from the parking lot to the bourse floor at the Santa Clara Expo. The issue that we really got blindsided on was the heat (heater) in the hall. We weren't told about the faulty heating system; the fact that half of it didn't work and the other half ran at full speed,

sounded like a rocket engine and still couldn't heat the building. The food concession had a limited menu, the prices were high and they didn't offer any fruit. This was a disappointment. The parking pass distribution was a nightmare. The dealers who paid for their table were issued a pass and that part worked well. The part that didn't work so well was the 'Table Sharing' or 'Piggy Backers' thought they should get one too. There were a lot of angry dealers. We'll work on this. All was not negative, even though this was a new location and a lot of our former key players dropped out. With as many problems that we knew about going in and the unexpected problems that hit us we managed to put on a pretty good show. We had many dealers say they had a great show and would be back next year. We had an increase in stamp dealers, thanks to Gary Morris of Pacific Midwest Co. The stamp dealers were also very happy with the show. There was a noticeable increase in dealer appreciation of the show committee. A lot more dealers expressed their thanks for putting on a successful show. Even with the new security team well distributed and visible, there was one incident of theft. The Front Desk Team did an excellent job of getting people in the door, collecting their ads and getting them to fill out the name, address and phone slips. The whole show committee is to be congratulated on putting on the 2008 show. **We would like to hear from our members on what they liked and didn't like about the show this year.** Even if it is something that we've already covered please write, e-mail or phone and give us your opinion.
