The board, even those who were 'Ho Hum' about it, is anxious to implement as soon as possible to save from \$135 to \$185 per month. In addition to the costs involved there are other advantages:

- The newsletter is sent out in a PDF file from a safe web site.
- Writing and sending it out could be on a timelier basis.
- No more driving to the printer, collating, folding, stuffing envelopes, applying labels and stamps, sealing envelopes and driving to the Post Office.
- No limits on the number of pages due to postage costs.
- Pictures can be larger and without restrictions.
- Only those members using the picnic and banquet reservation form would print it out, saving a lot of paper.
- You can just view and read your newsletter **in living color** or you can download it to your computer or a disk, or you can print it out.

AT THE SEP. 22ND BOARD MEETING

President, Ryan Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:41 PM. There were 11 board members present. **Youth President, Evan Hart** and **Board Members, Martha Davis, Marion Miramontes and Richard Shusterman** were absent. **Treasurer, Ray Johnson** reported that he still has a computer problem, but will have a report for the October meeting. **Program Chair, Bill Hurja** reported that the Giant Auction is scheduled for the October 8 meeting. **Medals Chair, Gordon Stubbs** reported that the reverse die for the 2009 SJCC medals is engraved. The obverse die still needs to be engraved. **Gordon** is creating a database of medals and he would like to add pictures of each year's medal. **News letter Editor, Ray Johnson** reported that he has reduced the number of hard copies by 53 and has requested more e-mail addresses from members, through the newsletter. **Librarian, Ed Sins** moved that the remaining 2008 newsletters carry an announcement that notifies members that the preferred method of receiving the club newsletter is by e-mail and if anyone wishes to receive a hard copy, they must request it in writing, by phone or e-mail. Those not responding by the end of the year will not receive the newsletter through the mail. **Ray** seconded and the motion carried. **Librarian, Ed Sins** needs help, at the October meeting, moving the library boxes from his truck due to impending surgery. **Ed** also reported that the "1701 - 1800 World Coin Catalog" is missing from the club library. Although **Ed** has the budget to buy new books for the library, we had several members volunteer to help find a replacement. **Membership Chair, Ed Sins** reported no new membership applications. **Web Master, Sally Johnson** reported that the web site is updated and she has received the October prize list from Ken Barr.

Old Business: A discussion about Show and Tell ensued. All agreed that Show and Tell is an important part of the meeting. **Past President, Fred Davis** suggested that program speakers should be scheduled before the break and Show and Tell be moved to after the break. After a discussion the board

decided not to change the schedule. **Historian, Sally Johnson** reported that **Member, Neil Lockley** is back at home, but in some pain. **Sally** also reported that she had talked to **Bob Bobbit** at the fairgrounds about the Americans with Disabilities (ADA) requirement to have a wheelchair present at the show. He wasn't aware of the requirement and said that those needing wheelchairs would have to provide their own. **Bourse Chair, Ray Johnson** will talk to the show security people for more information; the goal being to have a wheelchair at the First Aid Station at the show. **Youth Advisor, Sally Johnson** reported that she has ordered 2600 wooden nickels for \$249.78. A discussion followed on the show raffle tickets. **Ray Johnson** emphasized that we need more members selling the raffle tickets. The goal is to have the same quality of prizes as in past years with the tickets reading '20 Double Eagle plus other gold prizes' and a graphic of a \$20 gold coin on the ticket. **Bill Hurja** made a motion to price the tickets at \$2 each or 6 for \$10. **Keith Scott** seconded and the motion passed with one nay vote from **Ron Ishizaki**. **Bill** then made a motion that the ticket seller receives a sales incentive of one free ticket for every two books of tickets pre-sold. **Ray Johnson** seconded and the motion passed with one nay vote from **Ron Ishizaki**. **Ron Ishizaki** made a motion to eliminate all gold prize sales incentives. **Ray Johnson** seconded and the motion passed. **Ryan Johnson** initiated a discussion on the last revisions to the club by-laws that the board voted on; the job description of the Webmaster and the change of title from Jr. Vice President to Youth President. **Bill Hurja** will bring his latest revision of the Webmaster job description to the next board meeting.

New Business: none

Show Business: **Ron Ishizaki** bought a movie/slide screen for \$15 which can be used at meetings or for show presentations. He requested reimbursement. A motion was made, seconded and passed to reimburse **Ron**. **Bourse Chair, Ray Johnson** reported that 15 dealers had mailed in their bourse apps. The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 PM.
