This change is the result of having so many medals left over each year; it seemed to be the best solution. The board's goal is still to make sure that everyone gets the medals they want. **Medals Chair, Gordon** Stubbs will be offering this year's medals from the enclosed order form. The ordering, cut-off date is Oct. 15th. Medals from passed years will also be available at the monthly, club auction. Low number silver medals were auctioned off last month, and will continue being offered at each monthly auction until they are gone. September's numbers will be #44, #47 and #49:

<u>Lot 1</u> - Medal #44 - 2008 and 2009 - both medals as 1 lot

<u>Lot 2</u> - Medal #47- 2007, 2008 & 2009 - three medals as 1 lot

Lot 3 - Medal #49 - 2008 and 2009

- Two medals as 1 lot

AT THE AUGUST 24TH BOARD MEETING

President Ryan Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:39 PM. Ryan welcomed everyone to the meeting. Vice President Bill Hurja, Board Members, Herb Davidson, Renee Menzes and Youth President Evan Menzes were absent. Recording Secretary Lyle Okamoto read the minutes to the Wednesday, August 12, 2009, SJCC General Meeting. The minutes were approved as read. Corresponding Secretary Al Lo received the usual club newsletters, including the NCNA and ANA member newsletters. The Liberty Numismatic Society sent us a flyer for their Wednesday, October 21, 2009, book sale. Treasurer Ray Johnson gave his Treasurer's Report. Ray noted expenses of \$210 for picnic prizes, \$41.88 for printing and padding attendance pads, \$425 for meeting raffle prizes, and \$2796 for 200 ounces of silver for the 2010 silver medals. Rav has \$2133 in checks and cash still to deposit. Rav reported that the petty cash was \$21 short (\$150 instead of \$171). Ed Sins motioned to log in the auction cash shortage of \$21 as part of the overhead expenses. Sally Johnson The motion passed. seconded. Historian Sally Johnson reported nothing new. Medals Chair Gordon Stubbs has the SJCC Medals Order Form. Gordon spoke with Lee Kuntz of Masterpiece Medallions. Gordon handed out a sheet showing the Masterpiece Medallions stock dies. Picnic Chair Keith Scott reported the 36 adults and two youths attended our CCC/SJCC Joint Picnic on Sunday, August 2, 2009. Keith reported unknown expenses for ice, diet soda, and charcoal briquettes. There was approximately \$27 worth of drinks left over. Keith estimated that we were about \$15-20 under budget. Youth Advisor Sally Johnson reported on a new project to get a few youths to show up and start work on an exhibit, possibly to show at the Santa Clara Expo or at our SJCC Show. Ed Sins suggested using a map of Central and South America and obtaining a coin

from each country. Ed noted that this could be done at relatively minimal cost. Keith Scott offered to look for atlases in library book sale leftovers. Librarian Ed Sins reported Author David Lange donated a book on "Coin Boards of the 1930s & 1940s" to the club library. Membership Chair Ed Sins received no new applications for membership. Ed reported that twelve people have been dropped for non-payment of dues, and that one person has resigned. Webmaster Sally Johnson reported on some new features on our club website at www.SanJoseCoinClub.org. website now has Gordon Stubbs' SJCC Medal Order Form and a Calendar of Events for SJCC. Sally reported 15813 hits to our website. Sally changed some of the wording about our show being sold out to indicate that it is the 60 dealer tables that are sold out, but the public is still welcome. A discussion about California sales tax ensued.

OLD BUSINESS: Briita Ehlers said that she still has not received her oxidized copper medal for exhibiting at our 2009 SJCC Show. Keith Scott said that he still has the medal. Sally Johnson reported that she is working on October's Food Night which will be Italian Cuisine. The plan is to eat at 7 PM. About 48 people have signed-up so far.

NEW BUSINESS: Fred Davis passed around an award that he obtained from Awards-to-the-Wise for \$6. The award showed our SJCC logo mounted on a base, which has enough room for a 3-4" plaque. Fred suggested that we use something like this award instead of medals. No action was taken.

SHOW BUSINESS: Bourse Chair Ray Johnson reported that not a lot of new things have happened. The bourse is still sold out. Bourse applications are still being received. Ray took a trip today to check out our show space, and he thought that everything will be fine. The storage closet at the Double Tree Hotel has plenty of room for display cases; though, Ray was not sure where we will put our club trailer. Ray noted that we do have a meeting room. It may be the same room as the banquet room. A discussion about our show drawing ensued. A regular, gold and silver prizes drawing was favored over a 50/50 drawing, since a 50/50 drawing requires a special permit. Gordon Stubbs favored a \$2000 limit for prizes. Martha Davis suggested a gold double eagle, gold eagle, some Mexico gold 2 pesos, and ten silver Eagles as the prizes. Gordon noted that last year, drawing tickets were \$2 each or six for \$10. A free ticket was given for every two books pre-sold. Gordon Stubbs motioned for a \$2000 budget for prizes. Sally Johnson seconded. The motion passed. CSNA Rep. Al Lo reported on the CSNA Board Meeting. CSNA found the banquet costs at the Double Tree Hotel to be astronomical. The least expensive banquet would cost \$46 per person plus 22% service charge plus 9.25% tax. Other banquet venues are being examined, including Sonoma Chicken Coup and Bold Knight Restaurant. CSNA seemed happy that they have a meeting room at our show. Advertising Chair, Richard Shusterman reported on our show advertising. Our show ad is running once a month in the Greysheet and Online ads will run soon. Richard estimated our advertising budget to be the same as last year. It was suggested that our Corresponding Secretary send out news releases for our show, emphasizing that our show has moved to the Double Tree Hotel. The free events calendar in The Wave and Metro are all right, but paid ads in general newspapers do not work well in advertising our show. Richard Shusterman asked if we have the Double Tree Hotel hall reserved for 2011 if the show is successful. Rav Johnson answered that we do not have the hall reserved for 2011. If our show is successful, Ray indicated that he would like a bigger facility. To split our show between the upstairs and downstairs halls would not be a good thing. Martha Davis asked about show security. Ray Johnson will sit down with Lee Wilson to talk about security. There was a discussion on ways of reducing the cost Richard Shusterman of security. suggested that we reward our members with something for volunteering to assist our paid security overnight on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. This would reduce the need for one armed security quard overnight. Al Lo moved for adjournment. Martha Davis seconded. The motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 9:10 PM.
