Recording Secretary, Lyle Okamoto read the minutes to the Wednesday, September 9, 2009, SJCC General Meeting. Keith would like to give out club medals. free show admission coupons, etc. to those who attend his talk. Keith will need a display case too. A suggestion was made that our 2005 ANA/SJCC medals could be used, perhaps mounted on a card with club information on it. Ishizaki reported on looking into alternative banquet facilities for a tentative banquet date of Sunday, The prices were high at many venues. The Clarion on 4th Street, for example, would charge about \$62/head. The Creek Side Inn on Alma is generally closed on Sundays, but they would open just for us. The manager suggested a Martha Davis suggested buffet. looking into the Blue Pheasant in Cupertino. Kathv Benson suggested Zyirs off of Highways 17 and 237. Larry Benson, Fred Davis, and Bill Hurja went to our trailer and pulled out every case. They cleaned the interior of our trailer and reorganized the display cases inside. Instead of 21 cases per row, there are now 20 cases per row, for a total of 240 cases in our trailer. Larry passed out a handout titled, "San Jose Coin Club Trailer," which detailed how our trailer should be loaded. Larry also repaired some of cases, repaired grommets, installed locks, matched keys to locks, etc. The extra display cases, those of lesser condition, were placed in our storage locker. Ron Ishizaki asked Bourse Chair, Ray Johnson about the number of display cases that have been rented for our 2010 show. Ray answered that about 65 cases have been rented so far. Ryan Johnson thanked Larry Benson, Fred Davis, and Bill Hurja for cleaning up our trailer. Sally Johnson moved to reimburse Bill Hurja for lunch expenses of about \$20 (for the trailer cleaning crew). Martha Davis seconded. The motion passed.

SHOW BUSINESS: Ray Johnson reported that not much has changed regarding bourse. We are still sold out. Long-time dealers who put off responding to their bourse application are calling about not

getting their usual tables. Larry about Benson asked show advertising. Advertising Chair, Richard Shusterman said that our show ads will appear in Numismatic News, Coin World, the Greysheet, and free online ads. A discussion about our show advertising ensued. Ron Ishizaki noted that we have only one cart to haul cases. Ron asked if people could bring their own carts, hand trucks, and dollies to help haul cases. Sally Johnson moved for adjournment. Ray Johnson seconded. The motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 9:16 PM.



It never ceases to amaze me how much I learn about the history of our nation through numismatics. I, like most Americans, have always admired our 16th President, Abraham This year celebrates the 200th Lincoln. anniversary of his birth. We have marked this historical milestone by re-dedicating four new versions of the Lincoln Cent and issuing several other coins in his honor. He deserves every bit of the adulation. He made, what was probably, the most famous speech in our country's history, The Gettysburg Address, and it took just over two minutes to deliver. So, what prompted this speech and why was it so short? The condensed version is that after the 4-day battle (July 1 - 4, 1863) on Cemetery Ridge, overlooking the Gettysburg battlefield the Confederate soldiers retreated, leaving a huge amount of dead behind. David Wills, of Gettysburg proposed a plan to Governor Curtin of Pennsylvania to buy 17 acres of land, design a cemetery in a half circle and call it 'Soldier's National Cemetery'. The Governor agreed and in four months the cemetery was ready to be dedicated. Many dignitaries were invited, to the Nov. 19, 1863 dedication of the cemetery, including President, Lincoln. The President started working on his speech the night before leaving Washington. On the train he discovered that he hadn't expressed his feelings about how deeply he felt about the soldiers.
