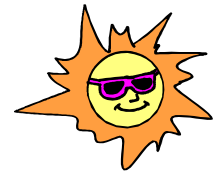

From the Board Meeting on July 26, 2010

- Call to Order- 7:36 pm
- Welcome 11 seated members and two guests- Steve Kooij and Ron Ishizaki
- Recording Secretary- Minutes from the General Meeting on July 14, 2010 were read and approved.
- Medals- Gordon wants to melt old silver medals to lower the cost of next year's medals. A worksheet was handed out with numbers and costs on it. A discussion followed. Al moved to melt 50 medals. Keith seconded. The highest numbers from year's past will be melted. The motion carried. Another worksheet was handed out showing the breakdown of costs for the 2011 medals. Order forms are being printed soon. They will also be put online for people to fill out and print.
- Treasurer- Ray has archived the club check register from April 30, 2010 back. A quarterly financial report was given. All expenses and rent have been paid. Ray emphasized that people requesting reimbursement or turning in money must have the white or green slip filled out. Ray asked for a change in the way we handle the auction cash as it has come up short twice. Bill Hurja, Auction Chair, is taking the auction money of \$171.50 and will be accountable for it.

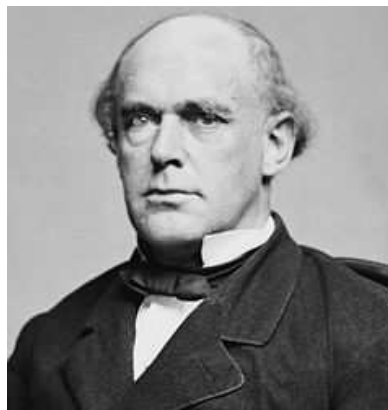
The Man on the \$10,000 Bill

Salmon Portland Chase was born in 1808 in New Hampshire. He graduated Dartmouth College and then studied law under William Wirt in Washington DC where he was admitted to the bar in 1829. Chase moved to Cincinnati, Ohio and began defending escaped slaves and seeking political reform to end slavery.

In 1840, Chase was elected to the Cincinnati City Council as a member of the Whig Party and in 1849 was elected to the US Senate on the Free Soil Party ticket. In 1855, he became governor of Ohio.

Chase was a leader in the movement to form a new party opposing the extension of slavery, and by helping to unite liberal Democrats with the Whig Party, he was one of the founders of the Republican Party. He lost the Republican Presidential nomination to Abraham Lincoln in 1860 but was appointed Lincoln's Secretary of the Treasury in 1861. As Treasury Secretary, Chase worked out the details for a national banking system that provided a stable national currency. The first paper currency came out in 1861 and was called "greenbacks" because of the green ink used.

Chase resigned his Secretary post in 1864, and Lincoln appointed

him Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. While Chief Justice, Chase selected John Rock as the first African-American attorney to argue cases before the Supreme Court and presided over the impeachment of Andrew Johnson in 1868. He did dissent on many important cases including the Slaughterhouse Cases in 1873.

Chase held the Chief Justice position until his death in 1873. In 1926, his portrait was placed on the \$10,000 bill in honor of his service to the Treasury.
