From the General Meeting on July 13, 2011

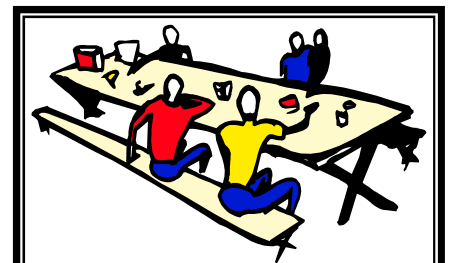
- Before the meeting, attendees enjoyed Hot Dog Night with hot dogs, potato salad, chips, and dessert.

GOING SOUTH ON MATHILDA AVE. - AFTER CROSSING THE EL
