From the Board Meeting on March 26, 2012

• Call to Order by President Martha D. at 7:33 pm.

- Welcome 15 Board Members and one guest- Ron Ishizaki
- Hall of Fame Chair Ed Sins had two nominators read their nominations. The Board voted and the next Hall of Fame member will be installed at the banquet.
- Recording Secretary- Minutes from the March 14, 2012 General Meeting were read.
 Keith moved and Ed seconded for approval.
 Minutes approved.
- Corresponding Secretary Lyle Okamoto had the usual mail plus a CSNA magazine.
- Treasurer Ray Johnson gave his report. All bills have been paid.
- Program Chair Bill M. announces April's meeting will be elections and medal design contest. Ed is speaking in May on Half Cents.
- Medals Chair Gordon Stubbs announces he received three designs for the medal design contest. He also has a list of medals that need to be engraved before the banquet. He will give the medals to Martha to place in holders.
- Nominating Chair Al Lo reports Sally Johnson will run for Treasurer and Ryan Johnson will run for Historian.
- · Picnic Chair Keith Scott announces the picnic is July 21 at Las Palmas Park. The price has been increased to \$5. Ray asked why the price was increased. Keith explained the higher price would mean no one would have to bring anything to share. Bill Hu. motioned to accept the price increase with Keith seconding. A discussion followed. Keith asked if the club would up the budget for the picnic. Ryan suggested cutting down the number of prizes. Al recommended defeating the motion and keep the price at \$3 with the understanding the club will subsidize the difference in cost. Bill Hu.'s motion was defeated. Al motioned to keep the picnic cost \$3 per person (youth free) with the understanding that the clubs will subsidize the difference in cost and no one has to bring anything as a pot luck. Bill M. seconded and the motion passed. Ray pointed out the keeping of the price at \$3 must be taken back to Cupertino Coin Club so they can discuss it there.
- Banquet Chair Ron Ishizaki reports the banquet is April 29. 19 people have signed up so far. Ron asked Lyle to send Sam Crisafuli an invitation to the banquet as a new 50-year member. His wife is included in the invitation.
- Youth Chair Sally Johnson reports 3 kids have been actively coming. Evelyn Daniels is running for Youth President. Sally sent a personal thank you note to Kevin Kawasaki for his \$100 donation to the youth program.
- Newsletter Editor Allison Paker asked Sally for the e-mail addresses for the newsletter so Allison can start sending it out as that would be easier. A discussion followed. Ray said he would like to see titles and last names used in the minutes along with more details and Allison agreed. Sally agreed to send over the e-mail addresses for the newsletter.
- Librarian- Keith Scott mentioned that through the ANA he can get ½ price Red Books and asked if he should get any for the club. Librarian Ed Sins said it would be

- helpful. Bill Hu. said he could donate Red Books from 2010 & 2011.
- Webmaster Sally Johnson reports we have 23,062 hits which is up 221 from last month.
 A new show in Ukiah has been added.
 Everything is updated.
- · Old Business- a) Fred Davis checked out the trailer and found some paperwork. A question was asked about where specifically the pink slip is. Fred said he thought Larry B. said that amongst the Treasurer items turned over to Rav was a folder marker "Trailer". Ed suggested going to the DMV to get a duplicate. Ron asked if the pink slip might be in the safe deposit box. b) Fred went to the locksmith and got a duplicate of the trailer key. He needs authorization from Lockheed to get a duplicate of their gate key though. c) Martha talked to Scott Griffin and asked him to come to the April Board Meeting to explain what he would like SJCC to do at his upcoming show. Ray also talked to him and said Scott will give SJCC a table if we provide some helpers for the front desk. d) Martha said she needs to order some Presidential holders and has a quote for some Air-Tite holders at about \$9 each. Ray suggested Scott-Western as a provider of holders at a less expensive price. Gordon has 15 holders left over. Martha needs 30-35 sets. Bill M. motioned to allow Martha the final decision on the type and look of the holders. Ed seconded and motioned passed. · New Business- a) Martha is having Fred get the Hall of Fame plaque engraved plus the clock at Awards to the Wise. b) Fred reports the Vice President of Cupertino Coin Club works with Santa Clara Scouting Organization. They are having a Scout-O-Rama in May and are offering a booth. We would need to have an exhibit and a 6-8 minute presentation. Fred asked if SJCC was interested in working with CCC on the exhibit. Ryan said they have information on the Scout-O-Rama already. The matter was discussed. c) Lyle discovered something online saying SJCC's corporation status is suspended. It was discussed. Martha asked Ray to look into it. d) Fred mentioned Martha doesn't want a gavel award as Presidential Award but would prefer a silver eagle. Fred suggested getting an eagle in plastic. It was discussed and decided the award doesn't have to be a gavel. e) Ed asked if there were extra wooden nickels because he likes to hand them out to people. Keith also said he'd find some useful. Martha suggested maybe ordering some more. Sally said she could order them early.
- Show Business- Ray has artwork done for tear-offs and mail-out postcards. Lots of coin shows are going on where we could advertise. Bourse fees are not set yet. Ray suggested sending bourse apps out earlier this year than last year. The show package is the same as this year's with a \$500 increase in hall rental. Sally said we would be able to save on electrical boxes again with Rich Medefesser's electrical help. Al asked if the price of security would go up because of a rule change about uniformed officers. Ray thought it should stay the same.
- Al motioned and Ed seconded for adjournment at 9:45 pm.

From 85N- Take exit 18 for Stevens Creek Blvd. and turn left. The restaurant will be on the left after about half a mile.

From 85S- Take exit 18 for Stevens Creek Blvd. and turn right. The restaurant will be on the left in about half a mile.

From 280N- Take exit 12B for 85 South. From 85S, take exit 18 for Stevens Creek Blvd. and turn right. The restaurant will be on the left in about half a mile.

From 280S- Take exit 13 for Foothill Expwy. toward Grant Rd. Keep right at the fork and follow signs for Foothill Blvd. and merge onto Foothill Expwy. Continue on North Foothill Blvd. Turn left onto Stevens Creek Blvd. The restaurant will be on the right in about half a mile.
