Herb had examples of many of the medals and plaques that commemorate the Pony Express which ended in 1861 when the telegraph connected the coasts. Thanks again Herb!

From the Board Meeting on January 28, 2013

- Call to Order by President Bill M. at 7:31 pm.
- Welcome 16 Board Members- President Bill M., Vice President Gordon Stubbs; Youth President Evelyn Daniels; Immediate Past President Martha D.; Recording Secretary Allison Paker; Corresponding Secretary Lyle Okamoto; Treasurer Sally Johnson; Historian Ryan Johnson; Librarian Ed Sins; Bourse Chair Ray Johnson; Board Members Steve Kooij, Fred Davis, Brian Daniels, Herb Davidson, and Keith Scott; Hall of Famer Al Lo
- Program Chair Gordon Stubbs reports February is Giant Show & Tell. In March, Bill Hu. will speaking on a TBD topic. A discussion was held as to rules for the Giant Show & Tell. It was decided that each person can show two items but the time limit would stay at three minutes.
- Medals Chair Gordon Stubbs reports we sold \$386 worth of medals at our show. 3 people have not picked up their 2013 medals yet. There are about three extras of each type of medal left.
- Nominations Chair Al Lo reports elections are in April. He hopes everyone will stay with their current positions. If a board member does not want to run again, please let Al know.
- Picnic Chair Keith Scott reports he will get with Lyle Okamoto to check the show schedule and then schedule the picnic in Las Palmas Park when a show is not taking place. Fred Davis reminded everyone we would need to go through Ray Niblett to reserve the park as he is a Sunnyvale resident.
- Banquet Chair Brian Daniels needs an idea of who's coming. Martha said to make a reservation flier for the newsletter. Bill M. asked about the menu. Brian answered it's standard. Ed said Don & Jean Pritchett will be our 50-year members. New Life Members will be Clyde Tuller, Barbara Lacariere, and Briita Ehlers.
- Youth Chair Ryan Johnson reports there were lots of kids at the show's treasure hunt which was called Trails Across America with Teddy. Each youth received a 2012 PDS Quarter Set.
- Newsletter Editor Allison Paker will announce the 2014 medal design contest in the newsletter. She asked Ryan Johnson for the show thank you page for the newsletter by February 8.
- Corresponding Secretary Lyle Okamoto had the usual mail. He also had letters from ANA candidates asking for

endorsement but mentioned that SJCC doesn't endorse unless the candidate is a club member. Lyle also had Long Beach show passes. Ed gave Lyle the names for sending out invites to the Life Members & the 50-year members for the banquet.

- Librarian Ed Sins thanked Brian Daniels for Lang's Lincoln Cents book for the library.
- Webmaster Sally Johnson reports we had 25,265 hits this month which is up 590 from last month. She thinks the blurb on the homepage about the show may have helped bring people into the show. All Northern California shows are on the website.
- Old Business- a) Ed Sins asked for the Hall of Fame guidelines to be placed in the newsletter again. The deadline is the February Board meeting.
- New Business- a) Keith Scott mentioned he enjoyed Jeff Shevlin's talk at the show about expanding the ANA. Sally mentioned how other local clubs aren't updating their websites or listing the own shows in their newsletters.
- Show Business- a) Gordon Stubbs passed out a packet titled "2013 Raffle Ticket Sales Summary". He went over raffle ticket sales, medals sales, & ribbon sales. b) Bourse Chair Ray Johnson thanked Gordon for the thoroughness of the accounting & for producing the careful spreadsheet. c) Ray discussed a problem Thursday before the show with our room not being set up on time because of the previous group in the room. Other problems during the show included the wrong tables being set up, the disappearance of the hotel set up crew, the lights going out on the block causing the bourse floor to be dark except table lamps, and the doors to the parking lot being locked every morning. Ray & Ryan will be going back to the DoubleTree to get some points added to the contract to get in the room earlier next year for set up. d) We had 78 table dealers. 6 were piggybacked on each other. 69 cases & 26 lamps were rented out. e) Dealers seemed satisfied with their sales. f) Gordon heard good things about security. Ryan expressed security was very good and we had no problems with them. Ray said we will probably use them again. g) Ray thanked everyone who helped out at the show. h) Ads for the 2014 show have already begun with ads in dealer goodie bags and tear offs at the front desk that people could fill out themselves to be mailed next January. i) Gordon thanked Ray, Ryan, and Sally for their work on the show. They got a round of applause.

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j) Keith noticed how many people did a lot of work but was disappointed some members didn't even come. Sally seconded that more club members could help out for at least an hour to lend support. Ryan mentioned security wasn't there to check wristbands. k) Parking was discussed. Many thought it went better this year. l) Ray reported the dealer at table 106 left a bag of supplies behind. If anyone found it or hears about it, please return it. m) Al was blown away by attendance at the educational forums. Most of the people were happy with the topics & speeches. There were about 32 people at each forum. Ray has 2 speakers lined up for the 2014 show. It was discussed how the forums were better marketed and how that helped attendance. n) Show Chair Ryan Johnson reports 7 of the 13 outside signs are trashed and have missing letters. We are working on getting them repaired. Ryan asked where Cupertino Coin Club gets their cases. Al Lo said CCC gets one from the locker. Ryan said there are now two cases with broken glass. 5-10 cases are missing from the trailer. They disappeared after the show. Security works at other coin shows and said they would keep an eye out for our cases. Ryan reports we need new carts. He suggested spending \$400 on two carts. Ray motioned for Ryan to spend \$400 on two new carts. Martha seconded. Sally suggested allowing \$500 to account for tax. Ray amended his motion to \$500. The motion carried. Ryan also reports our trailer needs replacing because it's rusting on top and the tires are disintegrating. Ryan suggested getting a large one to hold everything for the show including electrical cords. Martha said a larger trailer will not fit in the space at Lockheed. Ryan suggested moving the trailer to a covered area & getting rid of the storage locker. It was discussed. Ed suggested someone put together a proposal. Ryan said something needed to be decided in the next six months before the trailer completely falls apart.

SAN JOSE COIN CLUB HALL OF FAME GUIDELINES

Purpose: The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to provide a lasting tribute to members who have provided outstanding service to the San Jose Coin Club over a long period of time.

Eligibility: Any member in continuous good standing for five years shall be eligible for nomination for the Hall of Fame. Said member shall be in good standing at the time of nomination, if living, or a member in good standing at the time of his/her death, if deceased.

Criteria for Selection: The primary criteria for selection shall be service to the San Jose Coin Club. Service rendered to the hobby in general, or to other organizations may be noted as a part of the nomination and presentation, but shall not be used as a substitute for service rendered to the club.

Number of Persons to be Elected: No more than one person per year may be elected to the Hall of Fame. It is anticipated that in some years, no person shall be so elected. The Board of Directors shall not attempt to elect more than one candidate in a given year on the basis that no candidate was elected in a prior year.

Nominating Procedure: Nominations shall be made, by the February Board Meeting, to the Board of Directors, in writing, stating the name of the candidate, his/her membership status, the service or services performed for the club that are cause for nomination, plus any additional services to the hobby that the nominator chooses to include. Nominations may be made by a committee appointed by the president for this purpose, or by any other member of the Board of Directors with or without the approval or consent of said committee, at any meeting of the Board of Directors during the year. The secretary shall retain all said statements of nomination on file until the election.

Election Procedure: The president shall set aside time during the March Board Meeting, for the election of a candidate for the Hall of Fame. All written statements shall be read to the Board of Directors in their entirety, without abbreviation or deletion for any cause. If there is more than one nominee, the statements shall be read in alphabetical order. A period for questions shall be opened. Following that question period, an election shall be held by written ballot for a candidate for the Hall of Fame. Each member of the Board of Directors shall have one vote and shall vote for one candidate from the list of nominees. If no nominee shall receive a majority of the votes on the first ballot, a second written ballot shall be taken limited to the two nominees (or more in case of a tie) with the highest vote total. This procedure shall continue until one nominee achieves a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The nominee shall be the candidate for addition to the Hall of Fame. The presiding officer shall pose the question to the Board of Directors, "Shall John Doe be elected to the Hall of Fame?" A written ballot shall be taken. A two-thirds vote of all directors present, eligible to vote, and voting shall be required for the candidate to be elected. If the candidate achieves the two-thirds affirmative vote, he/she is elected. If the candidate fails, no person shall be elected that year.

Installation: The president or presiding officer at the annual banquet shall conduct an appropriate ceremony to induct the successful candidate into the Hall of Fame. The exact nature of the ceremony will depend upon whether the candidate is present, in absentia, or whether the addition is posthumous.

Maintenance of Records: The recording secretary shall retain a copy of all nominating statements for five years for the use of future nominations. After that time, the records shall be turned over to the club historian for permanent retention.

First Position: Rudy Gjurovich, pioneer member (holds membership #1), fourth president, and vice-president emeritus of the San Jose Coin Club, shall be given first place in the Hall of Fame, bypassing the normal requirements for nomination and election.

SAN JOSE COIN CLUB MEDAL DESIGN CONTEST RULES

1. The design must be submitted by a San Jose Coin Club member.
2. The design shall be on 8 ½" by 11" unlined paper in a circle of a minimum of 4" to a maximum of 8" in diameter.
3. A maximum of two designs is allowed per person.
4. The subject matter of each submitted design may be in the form of a single drawing, photo, postcard or a group of drawings in one design. Since most members of the club are non-artists, subject matter can be cut out or photocopied pictures.
5. The subject matter of the reverse design (not included in this contest) will be the San Jose Coin Club logo and/or club information, as designated by the Board of Directors.
6. The subject matter of the obverse design shall be of the designer's choice and include the year of the next show (no show information). The Board reserves the right to reject any questionable subject matter designs.
7. A written explanation of the submitted design can be included for clarification.
8. No names or initials are permitted on your design; these will be added to the winning design after the judging.
9. If the entry is of a private or commercial subject matter, the designer must obtain written permission from that owner and submit this permission with the design. If permission is not granted, the design will be disqualified.
10. Entries may be mailed to the club address (San Jose Coin Club, PO Box 5621, San Jose, CA 95150) or brought to the General Meeting. Entries must be submitted in a sealed envelope, with the member's name, and the words 'Medal Design Contest Chair' on the outside of the envelope.
11. All entries must be postmarked or submitted on or before the date of the regular March General Meeting.
12. In the event of IDENTICAL designs, the first submitted will be entered in the contest.
13. The winning design becomes the property of the San Jose Coin Club and will not be returned; all others will be returned.
14. The San Jose Coin Club Board of Directors reserves the right to modify the winning design to meet the requirements of the minting process. Any modifications will be cleared with the designer(s).
15. If the Medal Design Contest Chair submits a design, the President, at his/her discretion, shall appoint an alternate Medal Design Contest Chair to conduct the medal design contest process.
