**US Mint Sales:
Jacqueline Kennedy
Coins Top 12,000**

It's been a fun week for collectors. Last Thursday's excitement over the new Jacqueline Kennedy First Spouse Gold Coins was eclipsed on Tuesday by the 15-minute sellout of the Harry S. Truman Coin & Chronicles Set. Sales of the proof and uncirculated Jacqueline Kennedy coins reached 10,894 on the first day. Another 1,114 sold through Sunday, the latest sales figures from the U.S. Mint show, lifting their total to 12,008 coins or 40% of the authorized 30,000.

Both coins remain on back order. The proof edition was tagged with the status straight out of the sales gate. Adam Stump, the U.S. Mint deputy director for the Office of Corporate Communications, released the following statement on Tuesday that describes what happened:

"The Mint underestimated the initial demand for the 2015 First Spouse Series One-Half Ounce Gold Coins — Jacqueline Kennedy and, unfortunately, the products went on back order very quickly after sales started. As of this morning (June 30), additional product is arriving at our distribution center in Memphis that

will clear a majority of the backorders.

The Mint has resumed production and we expect to fulfill all customer demand in the coming days and weeks. We apologize to our customers for the delay."

In related news, in last week's sales article we talked about John F. Kennedy Presidential \$1 Coins and their surprisingly weak sales start. They rose another 387,900 in their first full week of availability to just over 1.92 million coins. That's still slow. The past two dollars honoring Truman and Eisenhower scored higher sales during their first few days of release.

Returning briefly to the Harry S. Truman Coin & Chronicles Set, Stump said in an email on Wednesday that 16,780 of the 17,000 sets sold in approximately 15 minutes. See photos of the set and more sales info.

The set is listed on the Mint's website as "currently unavailable" with a remind me button.
