



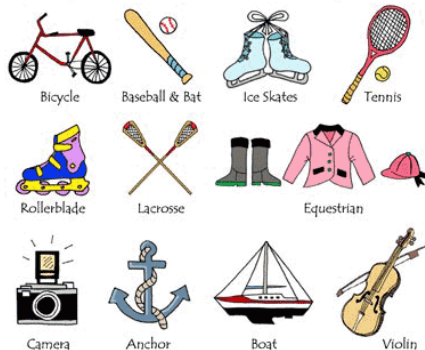

SJCC held **CSNA's 16th Annual Northern California Educational Symposium** here. It was by all measures, a huge success. San Jose Coin Club was the host of this event, with our treasurer, Sally Johnson acting as the Symposium Coordinator and Organizer.

Sally put together a team of 'Behind the Scenes Volunteers' that acted as a 'Well Oiled Machine'. Everything began and ended at exactly the time it was supposed to, according to the Symposium Program. The hall was opened on time and the room was set up, the snacks and drinks were prepared and set out, the sound system and video equipment were placed and hooked up and the program began on time. From the front desk we had a total of 31 attendees signed in by filling out an identification slip and received an envelope containing a Limited Edition Souvenir Card, event program, a last year of issue SJCC show token, two 2015 SJCC wooden nickels and the latest copy of The California Numismatist. CSNA Board of Directors Member, Herb Miles acted as Master of Ceremonies and introduced all of the speakers, as well as managing the hourly and special drawings. In addition to the hourly drawings, there was a special drawing following each speaker's presentation, which awarded the winner a prize that pertained to the speaker's topic.

Herb introduced the first speaker, Don Pannell, who spoke on 'Sacagawea Dollars You Didn't Know About'; an interesting look at some of the varieties, errors, and special issues of our little golden dollar. Herb then introduced Dean Birge, who explained where the term "Shinplaster" came from and what currency fits into the category. Dean's talk ended the morning session and Angie Windling and her niece Darlene Colbertson and family served a delicious lasagna and spaghetti lunch, with salad, drinks and desserts. Attendees mingled and looked at the four exhibits on display; starting with Don Pannell's 'Sacagawea Dollars', Dean Birge's 'Shinplasters', Sally Johnson's 'Harry Potter', and Ray Johnson's 'Trains'.

Herb kicked off the afternoon session, introducing Lloyd Chan, whose topic was 'Introduction to Collecting Ancient Coins'. Lloyd's presentation was enjoyed by several extra people, who came in specifically for his talk. Lloyd also digitally recorded the entire event. Michael S. Turrini rounded out the afternoon with his talk on 'Money from the Titanic', a new and interesting way of looking at the sinking of the unsinkable vessel with his observations on how money fit into the tragedy.

In Review, each of the speakers did an excellent job of presenting their material, as did Herb Miles in

managing the program. There was no fumbling around with the equipment or trying to figure out how it worked. Each speaker was well prepared and spoke with authority and answered questions in a knowledgeable way. Sally and Herb managed the prizes. Giving a special prize at the end of each speaker's presentation was a clever new twist on matching the prize with the talk. (following Don Pannell's talk, a slabbed, 2015 Sacagawea Proof 69 First Strike was awarded to Angie Windling, following Dean Birge's talk a 1923 Dominion of Canada Shinplaster 25¢ note was awarded to Lloyd Chan, following Lloyd Chan's presentation a silver ancient coin was awarded to Silke Higgins and following Mike Turrini's talk a set of two 24k gold plated, Titanic colorized coins were awarded).

At the end of the program a final drawing was held and every attendee's name was drawn for a prize. So, everyone went home with something and there were a lot of smiles, rave reviews about the food, rave reviews about the whole event and talk about next time.

Congratulations to Sally's and her team of helpers, donors, speakers and exhibitors. She showed all participants and observers how it's done and may have set a new standard for local educational symposiums. A very special thanks to all who donated prizes and thanks to Howard Feltham, Phil Iversen and CSNA for the opportunity to host this symposium at the San Jose Coin Club and thanks to all of the attendees.
